

Theme

Keep Calm and Carry On!

Our theme for this term is Keep Calm and Carry On, which will focus on World War II. After an introduction into how the war began and the locations of the countries involved, we will focus our attention on how the lives of children were affected by the war; looking at different perspectives from the people involved. We will be studying how the war impacted the daily lives of the people of Britain. There will also be an opportunity to identify how children were kept safe and we will explore how they felt during this time.

English

During English this term, we will be using a range of texts influenced by World War II. Children will have the opportunity to create different styles of writing using the books 'Letters from the Lighthouse', 'Rose Blanche', 'When the Sky Falls.' Each English and guided reading lesson will focus on a key skill which children will be able to use in their sessions and apply it to other aspects of their learning. Across the term, we will explore a variety of genres ranging from fictional types such as setting description and alternative endings to non-fiction types such as non-chronological reports.

Mathematics

This year we will be following our established school scheme- Power Maths. This curriculum mastery programme is designed to spark curiosity, excitement and nurture confidence in Maths. This term begins with place value. It is vital that children are secure with this concept in order for them to apply their skills. Children will be identifying the digits of numbers up to 10,000,000 as well as ordering, comparing and rounding. These skills will then be used to solve different number sentences involving the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Children will need to solve multi-step problems deciding which methods to use and why. We will then progress onto working with fractions. There will also be a huge focus on the rapid recall of timetables up to 12x12 and their related division facts.

Design Technology

The children will be researching air raid shelters and using the knowledge they acquire design and build their own shelter. The shelters that the children make will then be tested in our air raid challenge.

Following on from our work on electricity in Science, the children will also have the opportunity to use their circuit building knowledge to design and create a 'steady hand' game.



French

During the first half term we will be learning a selection of verbs and adverbs linking to common actions. Later we will be learning the vocabulary for some French foods and the location of French cities and popular tourist attractions in Paris

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Computing

Networks and Systems and Web Page Creation

During Autumn 1, children will be exploring the internet, how it works and how to stay safe whilst using an online server.

Within Autumn 2, children will embark on a project to create their own web pages. During this process, children will explore websites, understand the features of them, understand copyright laws and eventually design their own web page.

Science - Light and Electricity

This term's topics are light and electricity. We will be finding out about light and how we see shadows, reflections, and refractions. We will learn about how light travels, enabling us to see objects.

When learning about electricity, we will compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches. We will also learn how to draw circuit diagrams using electrical circuits.

Home Learning

Homework will be set on a Friday, to be returned by the following Friday. Longer projects may sometimes be set to complete and present. Spellings will be learnt at home and tested in school every Friday.

Children will read in school to a member of staff every week, either individually or part of a small group. At home, the expectation is that children are heard read at least 3 times and a comment is left in their school planner and it is signed. Consistent reading will be rewarded using our initiative 'Starbooks' when planners are checked on a Friday

Times tables will also be tested weekly. Please ensure that your child practises their times tables through TT Rockstars, in addition to their weekly homework.

If you have any books or artefacts about our topic, children are able to bring them in and share them with the class.

P.E

RE

In RE, we will be looking at the work of charity and we will learn about the work of two major faith based charities, Islamic Relief, Khalsa Aid and Christian Aid.

Spiritual Moral, Social and Cultural

We will be working towards the completion of our Year 6 Cultural Capital Journey. There will be a copy of the events and activities we will be completing in our planners. This term we will complete a poppy appeal enterprise to raise money for the British Legion and learn about the good work they do in our community. We will also be involved in regular sessions to discover activities that promote our positive wellbeing.

Creative Arts



Art - We will be creating poppy field art work inspired by the Commemorative artwork by Jacqueline Hurley. Our artwork will use mixed media of sketching, painting and sculpture. During Black History Month, we will be researching and recreating the work of Kara Walker and using famous athlete Jesse Owens as our inspiration we will practice our self portrait drawing skills and create small sculptures.

Music - Using our online scheme Charanga, children will explore the Neo/Soul genre in the unit called 'Happy.'
