These are qualities that we aim to nurture in all children to celebrate their outcomes and achievements.

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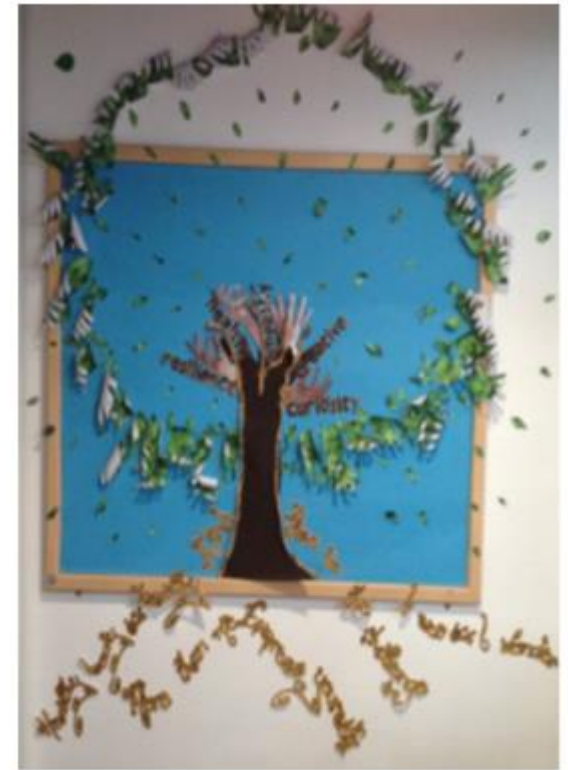


## Cultural Capital Journey

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Oak Meadow's behaviour system

Our house system will continue this year and your child has the opportunity to contribute tokens towards their house winning the half-termly behaviour trophy.

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## Certificates

To recognise and celebrate children's hard work and achievements, the tokens they receive will contribute not only towards their house weekly total but also their personal target to achieve a certificate of recognition at 50, 100, 200 and 300 token milestones.



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## It's Good to be Green!

Throughout school we operate the 'Good to be Green' system.

All children start each new day as green with the aim to keep their green cards all day, every day. If children do not adhere to the school rules, then yellow or red cards may be given as sanctions to remind the children of our expectations. It is possible to earn back a green card before the end of the school if the child then shows positive behaviour.

Children who remain green every day over a half-term will also receive an additional reward afternoon to recognise their outstanding behaviour!



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- 3 yellow cards in a week means that children spend their Friday lunchtime in reflection where they will be expected to complete a restorative behaviour form (recognising the impact their behaviour has had on themselves and others). You will be informed if this happens.
- If a child receives a red card they will spend their next lunchtime in the reflection room completing a similar form. Again you will be informed of this.
- As well as this, children will relinquish 5 minutes (per red card) from their end of half-term treat. This time will be spent with the Leadership Team.



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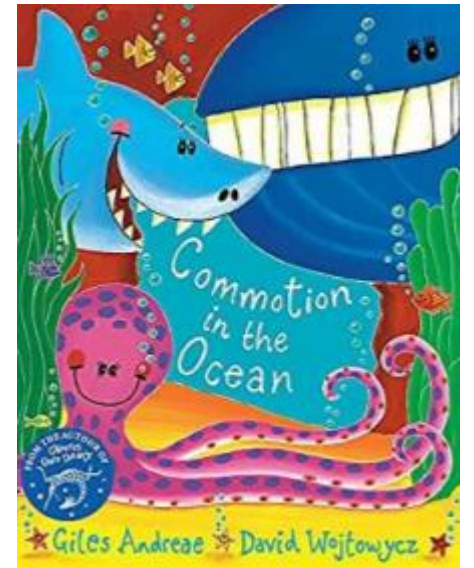

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## Maths in Year 2 -

We no longer use the PowerMaths scheme. We will be following the White Rose Scheme of learning.

Topics for Autumn Term

- Place Value using numbers to 100, ordering and comparing numbers.
- Addition and Subtraction
- Shape

Lessons will follow the **I do, We do, You do** approach. This encourages children to work collaboratively at first before showing their skills and understanding independently.

It is important for all children in Year 2 to know their times tables and division inverses in the 2, 5, and 10 times tables.

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## Maths Home Learning

We have made a significant investment in two online learning platforms to support your child's mathematical development.

**MathShed** is an online learning platform we have subscribed to this year to support concepts children are taught in school and supplement our mastery maths curriculum

New individual log-in credentials will be allocated to children in the coming days.

**Numbots** will support your child in learning, retaining and improving their recall speed for key number bonds. Please take time to log in with your child to experience and enjoy the platforms together.

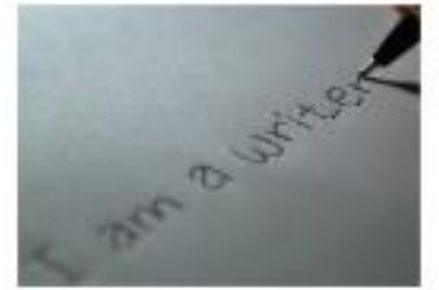


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## Writing in Year 2

During English this term, we will be using a range of texts influenced by Superhero authors such as Julia Donaldson. Each English lesson will focus on a key skill which children will be able to use in their session. We will be retelling stories, describing characters, writing letters and writing in a non fiction style. In all teaching and learning there will be a focus upon phonics, accurate spelling, grammar, neat presentation, the beginnings of joined handwriting and the learning of new vocabulary. Spelling lists will be given out each week in some reading groups that children will be tested on the following Friday. It is important children revise these words as well as being mindful of the high frequency spelling list and common exception words for their age/year group. (see next slide)

## Reading in Year 2

We ask for your continued support in encouraging your child to read regularly. We would encourage you to spend at least 10 minutes reading with your child each day. Please sign your child's diary after hearing them read. We will aim to hear your child read independently at least once a week to supplement their daily reading in Ruth Miskin and Guided Reading. Bug Club has books for your children to read and enjoy online. Within each book there are questions and activities for the children to complete. They will earn coins for doing so which they can use to play games and collect virtual stickers. Your child has been issued an individual login for this.



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Your child will be assessed each term in reading and maths.

Writing assessment is ongoing through the year.

There are no longer any formal KSI SATs however there are still papers that we will undertake in May or June. These will just aid us in our teacher assessments.

You will receive a progress report for your child at the end of each term.



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## Homework

Homework is an essential part of your child's learning. As well as weekly spellings, daily reading and times table practise, your child will be set maths homework too. Homework is set on a Friday to be returned by the following Friday. This may be through online tasks. Occasionally a homework project may be set instead of the usual homework. You will be notified if this is the case.



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## PE in Year 2

P.E will take place on Monday and Friday for both classes.

PE clothing is a plain white t-shirt, black shorts and trainers or pumps.

We strongly advise that children wear full tracksuits when outside across the Autumn and Spring term.

Jewellery should be removed before the lessons. If your child has difficulty removing their earrings themselves, please make sure that you have signed and returned the appropriate form, which gives permission for them to continue to wear them during PE lessons - accepting the risks involved.



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Please ensure any new updated information is passed on to the office.

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## Acceptable User Agreements

In the modern age, we encourage positive online behaviour from all children. This includes the amount of screen time children access each day.

To re-enforce this point, every member of staff and all pupils at Oak Meadow adhere to an Acceptable User Agreement that is applied to all devices and internet sites (including social media).

Please take the time to discuss the importance of online safety with your child and set clear expectations for how your child uses devices at home.

All children have signed their own Acceptable User Agreement in school.
