Theme

Arriba! Arriba!

Our overarching theme for this term is 'Arriba! Arriba!' with a focus on the geographical features of Central and South America. We will be studying various aspects of the Amazon Rainforest, including wildlife, rivers and mountains that feature in this part of the world. We will make comparisons between the countries that form the continent of South America, placing emphasis on the similarities and differences between these countries and those within the United Kingdom. As we investigate Central America, we will look at some of the customs and traditions of the people living, and have lived previously, in this region, as well as how different cultures are celebrated and recognised.

English

In all teaching and learning, there will be a focus on accurate spelling, grammar, neat presentation, cursive handwriting and the acquisition of new vocabulary. During both reading and writing lessons this term, we will be using a number of high-quality texts to help develop children's understanding of the craft of an author, and give them the chance to show off their writing skills through a range of outcomes for different audiences

Mathematics

- Addition and subtraction—mental and written strategies, including adding and subtracting across 10 and 100 and inverse operations
- Multiplication and division—using 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10
 times tables to multiply, divide and solve problems

- Identify the different parts of a plant and the flower
- Understand the role of different parts of a flower
- Understand the impact of growing conditions and compare different plants
- Explain the life cycle of a flowering plant
