English

In our writing sessions we will be using a variety of high-quality texts to help us produce our own pieces of writing, thinking carefully about the intended audience for our writing and the impact that we would like to have on them. We will begin by producing our own free verse poetry inspired by 'The Magic Box' by Kit Wright. We will then explore the classic graphic novel 'Ug' by Raymond Briggs, translating this into a written narrative, before drawing on our geography work on climate change to write speeches around this important topic.

Our reading lessons will continue to give our children the chance to read and enjoy a diverse range of high-quality texts, developing their reading skills and using these to answer 'big questions' around the text, beginning with the work of poet Joseph Coelho

PSHE

This term we will be focusing on the following themes:

Geography How is climate change affecting the world today?

In geography, our topical unit of work will give children the chance to learn more about climate and climate zones around the world, as well as how these are changing as a result of environmental factors. They will also explore the ways that we can help to make a positive impact on our environment.

Music – children will be learning to sing and perform 'Three Little Birds' by Bob Marley; they will also perform 'The Dragon Song', based on traditional folk songs from around the world

Art - we will be completing two units based around traditional prehistoric cave paintings. Firstly, we will produce a charcoal drawing of an animal, before using a palette of typical colours to produce our own cave paintings.

Values

Mathematics
