Oak Meadow Primary School is committed to ensuring equality of provision throughout the school community. - To tackle prejudice and promote understanding in relation to people with disabilities.
- Effectively support pupils ensuring progress is made by all, including vulnerable groups, i.e. boys and girls, disadvantaged pupils and SEND pupils.
