English

Inspired by our History topic on the Romans, the children will also be writing their own myths. They'll be learning how to craft powerful ales with rich descriptions.

Poetry, we will explore the acrostic poetry, where children will create their own poems inspired by The Lost Words by Robert Macfarlane. This beautiful book, which celebrates nature and the words that are fading from our vocabulary, will inspire the children to craft their own acrostic poems. Thhey will connect with nature, language, and produce poems that capture the magic of the world around them.

We will perfect our reading skills using a wonderful text: Wolf Brother It is a gripping story full of mystery and danger. This powerful book will inspire the children to write their own suspense-filled narratives. They'll focus on embedding dialogue skillfully to enhance the action, as well as exploring language that conveys urgency.

Geography

This term your children will explore the importance of rivers, both locally and globally, through a variety of exciting activities. They will begin by studying key rivers such as the Amazon, Nile, and Seine, gaining an understanding of their significance to the environment, people, and ecosystems. A Severn Valley Park visit will allow them to observe a river firsthand, linking their learning to real-world examples.

History

In Year 4 History, we will delve into the fascinating topic of Romanisation—exploring whether it was good or bad for the Britons when the Romans invaded Britain. They will learn about the key emperors who led the Roman Empire and how their leadership shaped the expansion of the empire across Europe.

PSHE

In Year 4 PSHE, children will learn about what makes a community and the importance of shared responsibility. Mathematics

In Year 4 Maths, we will focus on key areas of learning, including length and perimeter, as well as understanding decimals and fractions. These topics will help your children develop essential skills for measuring, comparing, and working with numbers in real-world contexts. Additionally, they will prepare for the times tables check in the summer term. To support their learning, it's important that children continue to practice their times tables at home using TTRockstars and Maths Shed. Regular practice will help build their confidence and fluency in multiplication and division.

Creative Arts

Art - The children will explore the vibrant and expressive artwork of Wassily Kandinsky. They will learn about Kandinsky's unique style, which focused on using colour, shape, and form to evoke emotions and ideas. Inspired by his work, the children will create their own painting.

Design Technology -

Music - The children will explore rhythm and performance through exploring how to play the Djembe drum- delivered by Wolverhampton music service.

Computing

This term, the children will learn about e-safety, focusing on acceptable and unacceptable online behaviour. They will explore data and information, including data logging, and develop skills in creating media through photo editing. Additionally, they will practice describing people in a digital context, building their understanding of how to communicate respectfully online.

Science
